## RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

**S** \*Ask the individual to **SMILE**.

**T** \*Ask the person to **TALK** and **SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE** (Coherently)  
(i.e. It is sunny out today.)

**R** \*Ask him or her to **RAISE BOTH ARMS**.

If he or she has trouble with **ANY ONE** of these tasks, call emergency number **immediately** and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

**T** (New Sign of a Stroke) \*Ask the person to **stick out their Tongue**

**NOTE:** If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.

## Candle Lake has Wonderful Volunteers

This year Candle Lake Parks and Recreation advertized for nominations for our Outstanding Volunteer award. Thank you to those who recognized the volunteer efforts of their friends and neighbours by submitting their names.

This year we would like to announce Joan and Bob Sajtos as Candle Lake's Volunteers for 2010. We hope that you congratulate them and give them a big wave when you see them in our Canada Day parade. Following is a summary of the information that helped to bring to light some of the Sajto's contributions to our community.

### "Bob's expertise and tools are benefitting Candle Lake"

Bob Sajtos had an exceptionable career as a teacher and administrator in the school systems of Prince Albert. Former students remember Mr. Sajtos fondly as one who was caring and structured as he guided them in their young lives and educational endeavours. Colleagues speak highly of Bob as a teacher and administrator. While teaching Bob volunteered much time to the community around him. Most of his volunteer efforts centered on the military. Bob was a reserve infantry officer from 1963 to 1992 first commanding a Prince Albert B Company and then rising up to command the North Saskatchewan Regiment in Prince Albert and after 1989 in Saskatoon. As a military officer Bob volunteered his services as an Aide de Camp to three different Saskatchewan Lieutenant Governors. Bob was a Training Officer, Saskatchewan Branch, Navy League of Canada. Bob is presently long standing President of the P.A. United Services Institute made up of retired military officers and affiliates. Outside the military field Bob is a Board member who has held different positions in the P.A. Group Homes Society.

Once Bob retired from teaching and moved to Candle Lake his volunteering actually increased. He was Emergency Measures Coordinator from 1998 to 2003 dealing with Y2K and one forest fire during this time. In this role Bob initiated procedures, recruited, trained and directed communications for all anticipated emergencies we might face. Bob is a valued member of the Candle Lake Trails Group especially since he brings besides his organizing skills all his "toys" to the various projects. These same skills and toys were instrumental in rescuing and maintaining the Aschim Heritage Homestead site for the Prince Albert Model Forest. When Communities in Bloom (CiB) was formed Bob's help was sought in many projects including the new turnout kiosk map project, Christmas lights, banners, distributing trees and continued promotion of the Aschim trails and homestead. Bob was a founding member of the Search and Rescue group in 2000 we all know now as 55 North Search and Rescue. He was key in organizing, recruitment, policy development and training for this group from inception to today. Bob was a Resort Village Councillor from 2002 to 2006 with responsibilities in Parks and Rec., Trails, Fire Smart, EMO and SAR. Bob was a "hands on" type of Councillor in Parks and Rec. involving himself in Christmas suppers, July 1<sup>st</sup> activities and many day to day activities. For many years Bob helped groom the trails for the Sled Dog races at Minowukaw

In all of Bob's volunteer efforts he has given his time generously with a consultative and inclusive approach to do something good for the community. Parks and Rec. feels that Bob would be an excellent choice for a volunteer award.

**"Joan likes to work with people"**

Joan Sajtos is a degree Registered Nurse who put her skills, education and expertise to use in a career in the Prince Albert Health System. Joan has been a consistent volunteer in all the communities where she has lived. A very basic part of her life has been to help people in any way that she can. If there is a job to be done, no matter that it may present road blocks, she accepts the challenge and in most cases has a successful outcome.

This trend has continued in Candle Lake. Following are some of the organizations she was or is a part of. She joined the Parks and Recreation Board in 1999, as a volunteer, then becoming treasurer. She looked after the Recreation Centre, doing the rentals, supervising the cleaning, choosing the sound system and supervising the system maintenance until a recreational co-ordinator was hired. Committee work involved: Canada Day Activities and Fall Golf Tournaments.

As a founding member of the Trails Advisory committee, all walking trails within this community have fallen under her review. She has also been very involved in the redevelopment of the Aschim Homestead, which is now a heritage site. All aspects of work at this site involved Joan, from operating equipment to co-ordination of work parties and lunches for crews.

Joan was co-ordinator for three years and is presently a member of our M.S.Society with its successful annual Candle Lake walk (always surpassing last year's amounts). She was involved in bringing in a Church building for our Community church group. She is a founding member of the Badminton Club, Yoga Club, and the Book Reading Club.

As a founding member of the Medical Committee, we have medical personnel at regular dates and times, throughout the year at Candle Lake.

Her help with the Sled Dog races at Minowukaw for nine years has been invaluable. Working in sub-zero weather with the long distance races, she handled problems that surfaced as she followed the dog teams.

Every Search and Rescue done by the 55 North Search and Rescue has Joan involved. She phones members to gather them for the search, also providing nursing services as required. Providing coffee and lunches has also fallen to her, often staying awake all night to be present when the search has been completed to provide care and compassion.

Joan has excellent writing and mathematical skills. Thus she has been involved whenever messages or other correspondence of a sensitive nature are distributed from Candle Lake groups to outside agencies or the public.

Presently Joan is working with a group involving regional partnerships. This is to develop a Grants Committee that includes personnel from surrounding communities in order to develop a cooperative group large enough to qualify for regional loans that may be available.

To keep going with this testimony would only serve to show more involvement of this individual in this Resort Community. Needless to say she has been and remains a truly caring citizen of Candle Lake and area, one that definitely deserves to be considered for Candle Lake's Volunteer Award.

## Candle Lake Watershed Stewards

The Candle Lake Watershed stewards in co-operation with the Sask. Watershed Authority, Sask. Research Council and Prince Albert Model Forest have completed two years of water testing on a baseline site in the middle of Candle Lake and inflows including Fisher, Hanin, Clearsand, Whitefish Creeks and the Torch River. These tests will continue for another year when another report will be prepared that will include our test results with those taken by S.I.A.S.T. students over the past 20 or so years. One of the tests performed is for turbidity and a device known as a Secchi Disk is utilized. It consists of a black and white metal disk which is lowered over the side of your boat; the depth of which the disk disappears from view is recorded. We would like to expand this testing to include as many locations on the lake as possible during the summer months. If you are interested in participating in the program, contact Dick Iverson 929-9765, and he will provide you with a kit including detailed instructions.

We regret to announce that the Household Hazardous Waste Day program has been cancelled. This was a temporary pilot project of the provincial government. We are very disappointed in losing what we deemed to be a very valuable service for our village. We are investigating other ways to collect and send hazardous waste for recycling as well as options for individuals to recycle their HHW.

Crown Shred and Recycle Inc at 460 40<sup>th</sup> St E in Prince Albert (763-9292) will accept all plastics including those numbered 1 through 7 from individual households for a yearly fee of \$108.60.

CiB has a contract with the Candle Lake Provincial Parks to collect the bottles and cans from the recycle barrels. Proceeds will help fund our projects. 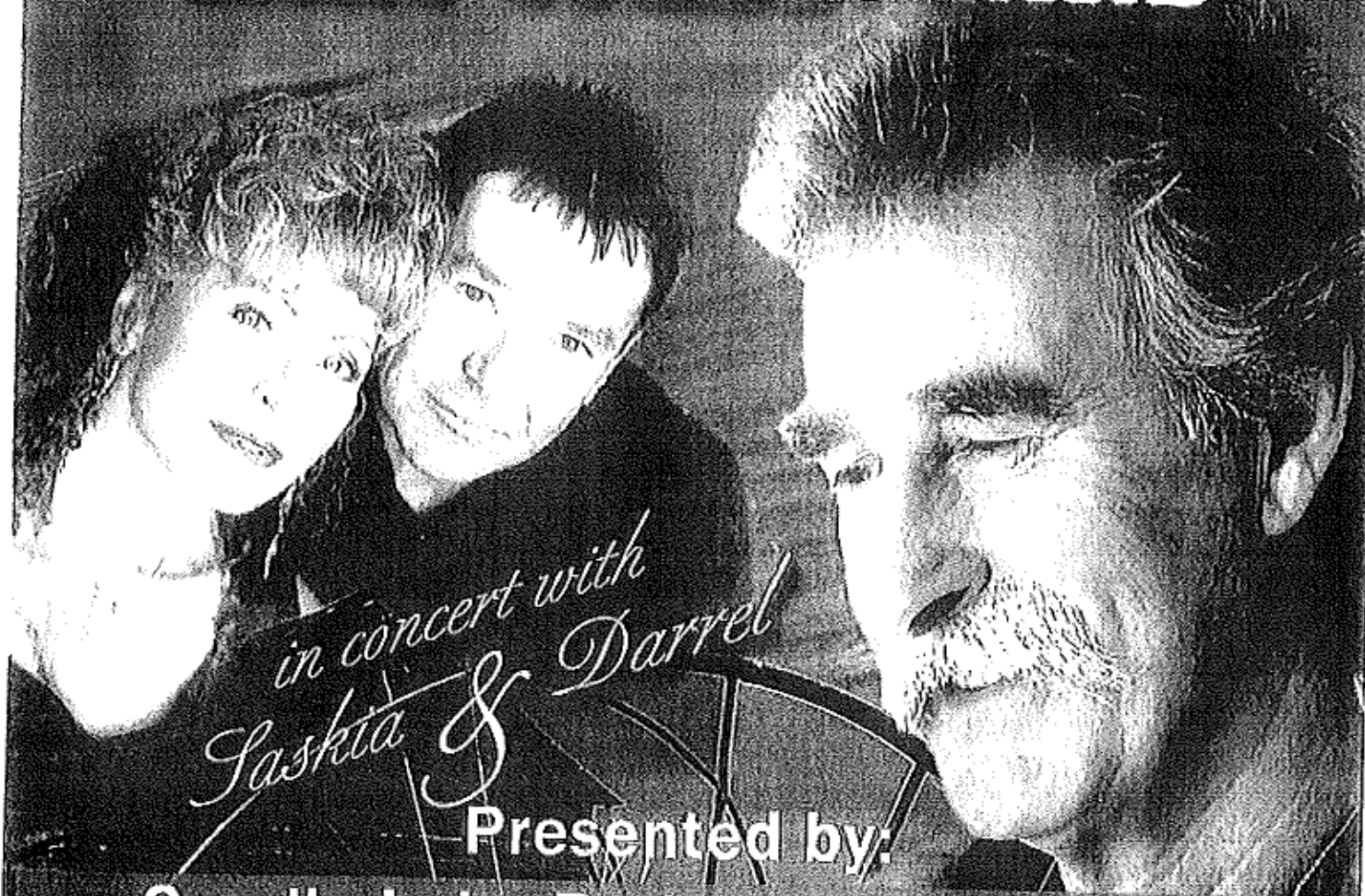

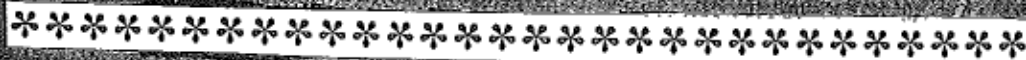

The Resort Village has recently passed a bylaw limiting the use of the landfill to residents and property owners of the Resort Village of Candle Lake. Users may be required to provide evidence of residency or property ownership. Authorization for use of the landfill by non-resident/property owners is by signed agreement with the Resort Village, only. As well, authorization to access the Resort Village lagoons is now by permit only.

**VANDALISM**

The Resort Village is in the process of reviewing the ATV Bylaw. ATV's have been causing considerable damage to ditches, trails and drainage throughout the Resort Village. **BYLAW ENFORCEMENT**

The Resort Village is in the process of contracting services for bylaw enforcement. Dogs and cats are prohibited from running at large and a new animal control bylaw is being implemented that will require licensing of dogs and cats and allow for the impounding of animals found at large. Education and enforcement of bylaws, including animal control, noise violations, nuisance and unsightly yards, encroachment on public/municipal reserve and open fires will be some of the areas of concentration. Garbage must be bagged and stored in containers with the lids securely fastened and placed at street side by 8:00 a.m. on the morning of pick-up. The fluctuation of population may vary the pick-up time; however, pick-up will not be prior to the scheduled day for each subdivision as listed above. In the event of a statutory holiday, the schedule will be adjusted to accommodate the holiday.

Grass clippings and leaves are no longer being disposed of in the landfill pit and; therefore, are not being collected along with regular household garbage. Grass clippings and leaves can be disposed of at the landfill at no charge, providing there is no other type of refuse included with the bagged clippings and the clippings are removed from plastic bags and disposed of in the designated area.

Only regular household garbage will be picked up by the garbage pick-up service; this **DOES NOT INCLUDE** building materials, fish filleting remains, large cardboard boxes, grass clippings, leaves, brush, etc. The Resort Village has purchased a new compacting garbage truck. Attempting to compact wood, metal bars (for example – lawn chair frames), concrete, etc. will damage the compacting compartment of the truck. *\*\*\*Please remember when packing garbage that garbage collection is done manually and consider the safety of our employees.*
