
3. Has this nominee passed his/her safety course?

4. How long has the nominee been actively involved in snowmobiling? Does this nominee look after the maintenance of the snowmobile they ride?

Aaron has been involved with snowmobiling since he was 11 years old and he would follow behind his dad on the 340 Scandic sled and ride around the trails making many miles on this durable sled. He slowly progressed to a used 500 cc and up to a new 800 cc sled. Throughout these years working with his dad they have been fixing and adding pipes and tracks anything to make it go faster. This year he was responsible for his first new sled and has been driving it on the trails to put signs up, clear trails, stock the wood sheds at the warm up facilities and ride the trails with family and friends. He put many miles since getting it in January 2015 and even though this past winter has not been the best for weather he has still managed to put over 1000 miles on this sled before it got parked a month ago. He is able to put many miles on his sled by either riding with his friends around the trails or when he rides with his family on club rides or is out volunteering his time stacking wood at warm up facilities or cutting brush to help with opening the trails in the beginning of the season. Aaron was very active in helping with the construction of our new clubhouse last year as he and his dad installed the flooring in the entire clubhouse.

Aaron has been a very active and great member of our club and his contributions to the club are much appreciated by all members.





5. Briefly describe some of the snowmobile projects/events that the nominee has been actively involved in over the past year.

For the last 2 years at the SSA show in November at the Saskatoon Exhibition center Aaron has enjoyed attending and promoting our club at the booth that we shared with the Candle Lake Golf Course and he was selling our tickets for the draw that we were having on March 7, 2015 at our Annual 250 Rally.

Our annual 250 Rally which is held in March is our biggest fundraiser and Aaron was there to either set up tables and chairs at the hall on Friday night or running around for the committees to pick up things that we tend to forget in the rush of the day. He went out on the ride and helped out at the lunch served on the trail with the set up or the take down. Our club also had him on stand by as a designated driver for people that attended the 250 Rally supper and dance that felt that they were not able to drive back to their cabins safely because we encourage everyone to be safe whether on a sled or car. Thanks to this service many people have a safe ride home.

A) Leadership: Aaron shows leadership for our younger generation of up and coming riders, he is always good to take these younger ones for rides and in this showing them the proper way to ride and behave on the trail system.

B) Safety: Aaron is always on his best behavior and ensure that other riders are following the regulations of the trail system by using hand signals to warn all riders on coming or behind them.

C) Promotion: Aaron is active in promoting our trail system and our club to new comers in the community and takes them and their friends on rides and shows them the area as he is proud of the accomplishments of our club and is proud to take them for tours of the area on their sleds.

D) Environment: In the spring our snowmobile club is responsible for ditch cleaning about 15 km and he is out there with everyone picking garbage.

E) Trail Development: He is out every time we have a trail cleaning work bee and he is lifting trees and brush as much as any of the adults in our club. Aaron also joins the group that goes out for the trail signing and staking of the ice each year and at the end of the season picking up the stakes that need to be returned to the storage unit. He and his dad have signed and stake the prince albert trail for the last 3 years together .

F) Fund Raising: As adults we maintain that they are in charge of the fundraising aspect of our club and encourage our youth to relax and enjoy the trail system that they help to maintain and will ultimately maintain in the future. In November our club attended the Annual SSA show in Saskatoon and Aaron helped out with selling tickets at the show on the Polaris 120 that our club was raffling off to help raise money for the club

G) Youth Involvement: He is a big part of the club and has always enjoyed the atmosphere of the kinship that our club has with all the members and he enjoys visiting with members during trail rides. Their involvement is seen as a good thing by all club members and they all comment how nice it is to see teenagers out and about and not getting into trouble or causing trouble in the community.

7. How has this individual promoted the further development of snowmobiling as a family activity?

Each weekend our club members get together and have family rides to different warm up facilities and have lunch or supper on the trail and all of our youth including Aaron are always the first ones to ask where and when are we going. He loves to be with everyone and it shows as they are always with his family .


