The Seniors Home Security Program is a program implemented by the Government of Saskatchewan. The program provides safety assessments and the installment of home safety improvements free of charge. Seniors who are home owners as well as seniors who are renters are able to apply.

You are eligible to apply if you are over age 65 and:

- 1. Your annual household net income is \$35,000 or less.
- 2. You have been the victim of a break and enter or home invasion.
